MARKS:

- Term Marks are CUMULATIVE that is, Term 1 marks are *included* in Term 2 marks, and Term 2 mark is the same as the Final mark.

The Practical Shop Work Mark is based on <u>productivity</u>, <u>preparedness</u>, <u>safety</u> and <u>cleanup</u> while working on assigned projects or assigned labs. The student will fill out a Shop Work Sheet of work completed at the end of every period which will be assessed a mark out of 5 per day. A variety of labs will be assigned.

N	Frequently late/absent, argumentative, non-productive, defiant, disrespectful, not prepared for class, unsafe, destructive, etc. If I were your employer, I would fire you.	

Achieving an "A" does not guarantee a "G" work habit. I have given "A" with "N", and "F" with "G".
